

RESOLUTION NO. 8-01

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR THE DESIGNATION OF THE UNITED BRETHREN CHURCH (NOW THE INTERNATIONAL CHURCH OF THE FOURSQUARE GOSPEL) TO THE COLORADO STATE REGISTER OF HISTORIC PROPERTIES.

WHEREAS, in 1874 the Little Thompson congregation became part of the Big Thompson Mission of the United Brethren Church; and

WHEREAS, after the Town of Berthoud was re-located to its present site, in 1886 a brick building was constructed for the United Brethren Church at the northeast corner of Fourth Street and Turner Avenue; and

WHEREAS, after outgrowing the previous building, in 1903 the congregation of the Church retained the services of builder John Bell and architect Montezuma Fuller to construct a red brick building. The structure was completed in 1904 at the approximate cost of \$10,000; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Vaughan, director of the Little Thompson Valley Pioneer Museum, submitted a Nomination Form for this Church building to the Colorado Historical Society; and

WHEREAS, the Colorado Historical Society has advised that the Church building located at 500 Fourth Street is being considered by the State Register Review Board for nomination to the Colorado State Register of Historic Properties; and

WHEREAS, the Review Board meeting will be held on Friday, May 11, 2001, in the Boettcher Auditorium at the Colorado History Museum located at 1300 Broadway, Denver, Colorado; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BERTHOUD THAT:

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud wishes to express its support and recommends to the State Register Review Board that the United Brethren Church building located at 500 Fourth Street be designated to the Colorado State Register of Historic Places.

This Resolution was passed by a vote of 5 in favor and 0 opposed at the meeting of the Board of Trustees on the 24th day of April 2001.
