

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the contract between the Town of Berthoud and South Loveland Sanitation District expired on November 1, 1983; and,

WHEREAS the Town of Berthoud has determined to provide waste water treatment at a financial cost comparable to that being provided to the citizens of the Town of Berthoud; and,

WHEREAS the Town of Berthoud has expressed substantial concern relative to the nature and degree of infiltration being experienced by South Loveland Sanitation District; and,

WHEREAS it is the position of the Town of Berthoud that its treatment plant is capable of processing the sewage of South Loveland Sanitation District but the infiltration into the lines of the District has decreased the plant's available capacity by creation of a hydraulic overload on the plant; and,

WHEREAS it appears that after meeting with the board of directors of the District, all, or substantial portions of the tap fees received by the District will be used to relieve infiltration;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Berthoud that:

1. The South Loveland Sanitation District appears to be making a serious effort to correct its infiltration problems. This is being backed by a financial commitment which is funded primarily by the money raised through the District's portion of the tap fees it collects.
2. The District's tap fees will be raised primarily through sales to property presently within the District and property to be included within the District in the future.
3. The Board of Trustees cannot legally control the operations of the District and it may continue to operate pursuant to statute and regulation.
