If you're traveling outside the U.S. this summer and haven't checked your passport's expiration date in a while, now is the time to do it. Currently, the turnaround time for a passport is approximately six to eight weeks. (It will take two to three weeks if you pay extra for the expedited service.) It is very easy to renew a passport at Town Hall.

SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT

Appointments are required for all passport services and can be made by calling 970-532-2643.

COMPLETED FORMS

Complete the necessary DS-11 form before your visit to make the process faster. Find all the forms online at www.travel.state.gov. (Remember to use black ink.) Paper forms are also available at Town Hall.

PERSONAL PHOTO

You must provide one photograph that meets all of the requirements with your application. We offer photo services at Town Hall for an additional fee. This fee may be paid by cash or debit/credit card.

PROOF OF U.S. CITIZENSHIP & GOVERNMENT ISSUED PHOTO ID

These usually include a state-issued birth certificate, or a certificate of naturalization, and a Colorado Drivers' License.

PAYMENT

U.S. Department of State Passport Fee may be paid by a check or money order only, made out to the U.S. Department of State with the applicant's full name and date of birth in the memo line. A separate check or money order is required for each applicant. The Town of Berthoud Acceptance Fees can be paid with cash or debit/credit card.

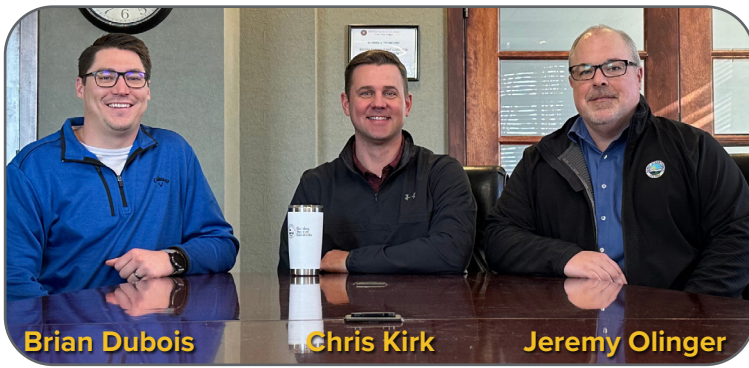

This month, in our Meet the Team series, we highlight the gentlemen who manage our town: Administrator Chris Kirk, Deputy Administrator Jeremy Olinger, and Assistant to the Administrator Brian Dubois. Chris has been with the Town since 2018 and recently received the Credentialed Manager designation from the International City/County Management Association (ICMA); he says, "Traditions are what make a hometown special, so having spaces and opportunities for families to create those memories is what makes up 'the good old days' in people's lives."

Jeremy, a graduate of Berthoud High School, just celebrated 21 years working with the town. Starting in Parks and Recreation and working his way through the department, he understands Berthoud's heart and soul more than many. During their tenure, the Town has enhanced infrastructure by upgrading our water and wastewater facilities and investing millions of dollars into road improvements. In addition, the Town has built new parks, a recreation center, eight new pickleball courts, and miles of trails.

Above all, they strive to be good stewards of the community we all love. Through strategic planning and partnerships with local businesses and non-profits, they aim to make Berthoud a town where residents not only live but are also actively engaged and proud to call home.
