On Tuesday, April 7, 2026, the Town of Berthoud will hold its Regular Municipal Election. Residents will vote for four Town Trustee seats: three elected to 4-year terms and one to a 2-year term. Nomination petitions will be available and may be circulated beginning Tuesday, January 6, 2026, and are due in-person to the Town Clerk no later than the close of business on Monday, January 26, 2026.
