2026 UTILITY RATE ADJUSTMENT

Water and Wastewater Rate Increase

In 2023, the Town of Berthoud completed a masterplan study of our water and wastewater system. That study found that the rates we were charging were not keeping up with inflation and necessary infrastructure maintenance and improvements. For 2026, an 8% adjustment for wastewater utility and a 5% adjustment for water utility will continue our investment to ensure high-quality water production and reliable wastewater management. In addition, this keeps our promise to the town to take care of existing infrastructure and grow in a sustainable manner. The increase to an average water & wastewater bill will amount to approximately \$7.75 per month and will appear on February's utility bills.

What will this money be used for?

These additional fees will go towards inflationary expenses such as transportation, fuel, chemicals, and power. It will also help fund additional staffing for the utility, as well as equipment and construction costs associated with rehabilitating and improving aging infrastructure. It also allows us to continue meeting and exceeding clean water and safe drinking water regulations as set by the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment.

How we Compare

We understand that everyone is affected by rising costs across all aspects of life. Still, even with the proposed increase, Berthoud's water utility rates will be below 5% the average of our neighbors in Larimer and Weld Counties. In addition, we will continue to aggressively scrutinize our operations, seeking ways to cut costs to help reduce possible increases in the future.
